Peter Stewart qualified as an architect after training at the University of Cambridge and the Polytechnic of Central London. He spent fifteen years working in practice in central London, during which time he was responsible for large office and residential projects at all stages from inception to construction.

In 1997 he became Deputy Secretary of the Royal Fine Art Commission (RFAC) and in 1999 joined the newly-formed CABE, a government advisory body (now Design Council CABE). Until 2005 he was Director of CABE's design review programme, responsible for expert advice on major development proposals across England. His work at the RFAC and CABE involved him in advising on many of the most significant projects in the country.

He is the principal author of a number of CABE publications, including *Design Review*, which sets out its method of assessing projects. He drafted the original CABE/EH *Guidance on Tall Buildings*.

In 2005 he founded Peter Stewart Consultancy, which provides expert advice to private and public sector clients on architecture, urban design and planning. Between 2005 and the present he has acted as townscape consultant on major projects in London and elsewhere. He has appeared as an expert witness at many planning inquiries.

He serves as a member of the following bodies: Design Council CABE's enabling panel and Planning Advisory Panel; the Council of the RIBA; the Stratford City Design Review Panel; and the Convoys Wharf Design Review Panel. In the past he has served as Chair of the regional design review panel for the East Midlands; as a member of the London Advisory Committee of English Heritage; and as Chair of the Planning Group of the RIBA.
