Dan Thomson studied History at the University of Cambridge, graduating with first class honours in 1997.

Dan has over 20 years' experience working in the built environment sector. He worked at the Church Commissioners for England from 1999–2001, where his role included work with the Church Heritage Forum.

In 2001, Dan joined the staff of CABE as part of the design review programme, which offered expert advice on major development proposals across England. As well as writing design review panel minutes, he played a key role in the production of a number of CABE publications. He is the principal author and editor of Design Reviewed 1 and 2. Later, Dan worked as a design review advisor, guiding major projects through the CABE design review process, writing advice letters to applicants and providing advice to DCMS on post-war listing cases.

Dan joined Peter Stewart Consultancy in 2008. Since then, he has been principally responsible for the writing of townscape assessments, heritage assessments and design reports for a wide range of development proposals. In particular, Dan has extensive experience of producing reports for major developments requiring an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), many of which have proposed tall buildings. Through this work, Dan has gained in-depth knowledge of the EIA process and the methodology required for townscape assessment within an EIA.

Examples of recent projects Dan has worked on include the Newfoundland, Dollar Bay and South Quay Plaza residential towers on the Isle of Dogs; the redevelopment of the Whitgift Centre in Croydon; and the Citizen M hotel, near the Tower of London.
